- Promote environmental justice and equity by amplifying the voices of communities most affected by environmental degradation and climate change, while advocating for inclusive solutions.

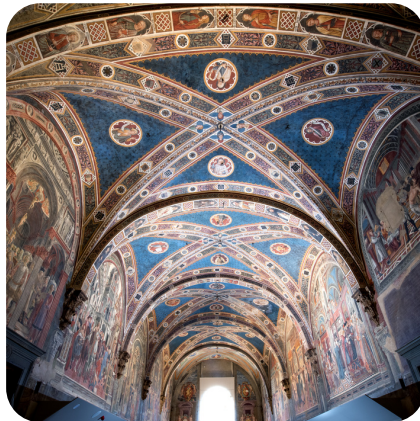

Siena is a historic Tuscan city renowned for its medieval heritage, unique atmosphere, and cultural significance. According to legend, it was founded by Senio and Ascanio, sons of Remus, whose symbol—the She-Wolf—remains an emblem of the city. Historically, Siena originated as the Roman colony Sena Julia under Emperor Augustus and later became an important trading center. During the Middle Ages, its strategic position along the Via Francigena pilgrimage route fostered economic growth, transforming Siena into one of the most influential cities in medieval Italy.

Meeting Place

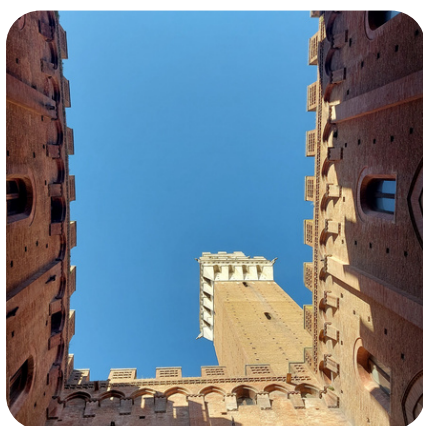
Siena City Hall

Located in the famous Piazza del Campo, it is one of the finest examples of Gothic civic architecture in Italy.

The building houses important medieval frescoes and the renowned Civic Museum.

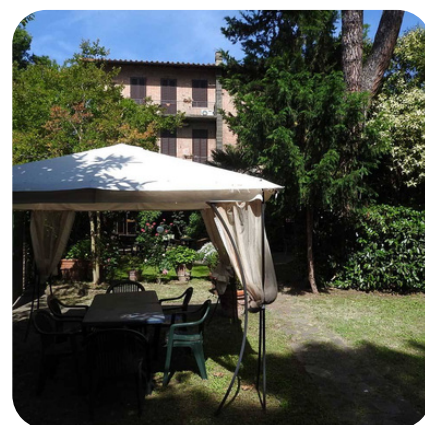


Accommodation
